1.0 SPORT:

- 1.1 Competition Site: North Battleford Civic Centre
- 1.2 Competition Dates: February 21-24, 2018
- 1.3 Sanction: Yes Skate Canada Saskatchewan

2.0 PARTICIPANTS:

- 2.1 Number of Competitors per District: Male __4_ Female__10__
- 2.2 Coaches and Managers per District: Coach_2_ Manager_1_

Note: Sports that have both male and female competitors must ensure that at least one coach/manager is of the opposite gender of the other(s)

3.0 CLASSIFICATIONS:

3.1 Year of Birth: January 1, 2002 - January 1, 2008

Competitors must be minimum ten (10) years of age to maximum sixteen (16) years of age as of January 1st, preceding the Games.

4.0 ELIGIBILITY:

4.1 Athletes: In accordance with the Skate Canada Rule Book

Class 1 Free Skate U12 (Under 12 as of January 1st, 2018,)

- Skaters must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze)
 Free Skate test but no higher than the complete STAR 6 (Senior Bronze)
 Free Skate test.
- Skaters may have passed one (1) part of the STAR 8 (Junior Silver) Free Skate test but no higher.

Class 2 Free Skate U15 (Under 15 as of January 1st, 2018,)

- Skaters must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze)
 Free Skate test but no higher than the complete STAR 8 (Junior Silver)
 Free Skate test.
- Skaters may have passed one (1) part of the STAR 10 (Senior Silver) Free Skate test but no higher.

Class 3 Free Skate U17 (Under 17 as of January 1st, 2018)

- Skaters must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze)
 Free Skate test but no higher than the complete STAR 10 (Senior Silver)
 Free Skate test.
- Skaters may have passed one (1) part of the Gold Free Skate test but no higher.
- Class 1 Dance One (1) partner may have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) Dance test but no higher complete dance test.
- Class 2 Dance One (1) partner may have passed the complete STAR 6 (Senior Bronze) Dance test but no higher complete dance test. Both partners must have passed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) Dance test.
- Class 3 Dance One (1) partner may have passed the complete STAR 8 (Junior Silver) Dance test but no higher complete dance test. Both partners must have passed the STAR 6 (Senior Bronze) Dance test.

Competitors can compete in two (2) events – One (1) Singles event and one (1) Dance event.

- Dance teams from two (2) different Districts must declare their District by December 1st, 2017
- Maximum of three (3) competitors / couple per event per District
- Skaters must meet the test requirements as of November 1st, 2017
- Dance couples must be comprised of one (1) woman and one (1) man

4.2 Coaches:

- Regional Coach (Primary STARSkate) Trained
- All coaches must be registered as Skate Canada Professional Coaching Members for the current skating season
- Coaches must register in person and show their Skate Canada Professional Coach Membership Card which includes their photo
- Completed Respect in Sport
- Coaches and Managers must have a Criminal and Vulnerable Sector record check.

ON-LINE REGISTRATION

<u>All registrations must be completed online.</u> The registration site can be accessed on the "Competition" page of the Skate Canada – Saskatchewan website at <u>www.skatecanadasaskatchewan.com</u> located with the competition information.

The first time you use the online registration site, you will be required to create a profile by clicking on "Register Now". When entering contact information, please use the skater's name. The Skate Canada Number must be entered as per the skater's Skate Canada Card (i.e. 10 digits including all zeros). Information is never shared with third parties. Once you have completed your profile and accepted the waivers, you will receive a confirmation screen.

You are now ready to register for the competition, click "Sign In". Enter the skater's Skate Canada Number (remember to include the zeros) and your password to complete the sign in. Click on "Register" and select the competition you wish to register for. Click "Choose" and select the events you wish to register in. Planned Program Sheets must be submitted with your registration. Planned Program Sheets will not be accepted onsite.

7.1 Type of Competition Singles Free Skate and Dance

7.2 Events

SINGLES (Will consist of one (1) part only – free skate program)

WOMEN AND MEN

(1) Class 1 Free Skate

Skaters will perform a program of two and one half (2.5) minutes in length +/- 10 seconds. Well Balanced program criteria for the Pre-Juvenile will be used. The CPC scoring system will be used.

(2) Class 2 Free Skate

Skaters will perform a program of two and one half (2.5) minutes in length +/- 10 seconds. Well Balanced program criteria for the Juvenile will be used. The CPC scoring system will be used.

(3) Class 3 Free Skate

Skaters will perform a program of three (3) minutes in length +/- 10 seconds. Well Balanced program criteria for the Pre-Novice will be used. The CPC scoring system will be used.

DANCE (will consist of one part only – pattern dances)

(1) Class 1 Dance

Skaters will skate the pattern dances drawn for the 2018 STAR 4/STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) Couples Pattern Dance event.

(2) Class 2 Dance

Skaters will skate the pattern dances drawn for the 2018 STARSkate competition STAR 6/STAR 7 (Senior Bronze) Couples Pattern Dance event.

(3) Class 3 Dance

Skaters will skate the pattern dances drawn for the 2018 STARSkate competition STAR 8/STAR 9 (Junior Silver) Couples Pattern Dance event.

8.0 RESULTS:

The Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) Judging System will be used for all event categories.

9.0 TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE:

In accordance with the Skate Canada Rule Book.

10.0 SPORT PROTEST PROCEDURE:

In accordance with the Skate Canada Rule Book.

11.0 EQUIPMENT:

Ice surface, skates, appropriate skating attire and music.

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies.

Competitors, who have music composed especially for their program either wholly or in part, shall be responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

<u>For the information of Dance competitors:</u> 2001 Skate Canada Series 8 music will be used for all pattern dance events.

Music Requirements

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies.

Competitors, who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, are responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and/or television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.



Music will be accepted electronically via WAV format or submitted on CD at the competition. A link to attach music files will be provided to registered skaters after registration has closed. If

music is submitted electronically, a backup CD must be submitted at the competition.

Music Requirements

Each entry must provide two CDs for the competition upon registration, one for competition - marked "Master" and one for back up - marked "Copy".

Standard Specifications for CDs

- a. Only one program shall be recorded on each CD.
- b. The start of the music shall be recorded on the CD with less than two seconds of lead in.
- c. Competitor's name followed by category, program type short or free, etc, and music time shall be shown on the CD label.
- d. Each CD shall be enclosed in a plastic case marked with the skater's name, category, program type short or free, etc, and total music time.

A committee of three (3) members appointed by the Sports Committee with approval of the Technical Advisory Board:

- 1. Sport Chairperson, Host Community for sport in question (or designate)
- 2. Provincial Sport Governing Body Chairperson (or designate)
- 3. Provincial Technical Liaison
