2.0 PARTICIPANTS

2.1 Number of Competitors

Generic: Male: 5
Female: 5

Special Olympics: Mixed: 5 athletes/team
Team formation is not subject to a given male/female ratio and teams may also be made of exclusively males or females.

2.2 Coaches and Managers:

Generic: Coach: 1 Manager: 1

Special Olympics: Coach: 1 Manager: 1
In order to adhere to the standard 1:4 volunteer to athlete ratio, a manager must accompany each bowling team.

Note: Sports that have both male and female competitors must ensure that one coach/manager is male and the other coach/manager is female.



3.0 CLASSIFICATIONS:

3.1 Generic Athletes:

Minimum 11 years of age and a maximum 16 years of age upon commencement of the Games competition.

3.2 Year of Birth for Special Olympic Athletes:

All Competitors must be born in 1985 or later. Note: All Special Olympics athletes for the Saskatchewan Games must be a minimum of 10 years of age and a maximum of 29 years of age upon commencement of the Games competition.

NOTE: In a multi-sport games atmosphere, the mandatory level of participant should be conducive to the many challenges facing participants in a village atmosphere. Recognizing the long term athlete development model, Train to Train level, the designated age classification should be consistent, ensuring a continuum in preparing participants for a higher level of competition.

4.0 ELIGIBILITY

4.1 Athletes:

Generic:

All athletes must abide by the residency criteria and regulations outlined in the Saskatchewan Games Handbook. Member of Bowling Federation of Saskatchewan.

Special Olympics:

Each athlete and team must be registered and in good standing with an accredited Special Olympics Saskatchewan District/Community.

All 5 athletes on the team must reside or attend school within the same Saskatchewan Games District they plan to represent.

All athletes must be registered with the team that they are playing on.

The team must have been training in the sport that they are competing in for a minimum of three months or thirty hours prior to Saskatchewan Games.

Each team will be required to participate in one District Qualifying Competition during the year preceding Games.

4.2 Coaches: Criminal Record Check required for all coaches.

Generic:

Level 1 certified as of December 31, 2013.

Special Olympics:

Coaches must have at a minimum:

- NCCP-SOC Level 1 Certification or SOC Competition Sport Trained and



- 5-Pin Bowling Level 1 Technical or the new NCCP Equivalent and
 - be a member in good standing with Special Olympics Saskatchewan.
- Managers must:*
- Be endorsed by their District/Community Executive, and be members in good standing with Special Olympics Saskatchewan.

4.3 Exclusions:

Generic:

None

Special Olympics:

Any athlete that has participated in the Special Olympics World Games in the sport of bowling is **not** eligible.

4.4 Team Definition and Alterations:

Generic:

A final district roster must consist of a maximum of ten players plus a male and female coach/manager.

Special Olympics:

A final team roster must consist of five players, a coach, and a manager. All players listed on the final team roster must have an opportunity to play during the course of the Games.

(*NOTE: A final team roster is a complete list of all players, the coach, and manager registered with a team.)

Medical Replacement policy:

In case of player illness or injury after the final roster has been submitted, teams will be permitted to pick up additional player(s) who are registered and participated with a community/district during the district qualifying competition. The Saskatchewan Games Council must approve all substitution after the final roster is approved.

The replacement player (s) must also meet the athlete eligibility criteria as outlined above (Section 4.1 – Athlete Eligibility [Special Olympics]).

Teams who arrive at a Provincial Games with:

- i) less than the minimum number of players, or
- ii) drop below the minimum number of players for the duration of the tournament,

shall only be eligible to play in an exhibition division of the Games and would not qualify for awards or placement points in the tournament and are therefore ineligible to advance to higher level of competition.

Individual bowlers are still eligible for singles competition.

7.0 COMPETITION:

7.1 Type of Competition:

Generic:



A match play format shall be used to determine the standings in the Team Round Robin. Each bowler who beats their opponent on the opposing team shall receive one (1) point. Three (3) points shall be awarded to the team that has a higher pinfall for the game, making a total of eight (8) points maximum for the game.

Teams will play a Single Round Robin with the top 4 teams advancing to a step ladder final. The top 4 Singles based on individual score during the team round robin will advance to a stepladder final. The top qualifier in the team and singles round robin must be beaten twice in the stepladder final.

Special Olympics:

It is a S5PBA sanctioned event and thus C5PBA rules will be followed.

NOTE: As per Special Olympics Canada 5-Pin Bowling Tournament Rules, an individual with a visual impairment may have their coach give them pre-delivery assistance. The coach may properly align the athlete, but cannot assist in the delivery of the ball.

8.0 RESULTS:

Final standings for the top 4 teams and singles based on results of the stepladder final. Positions for the remaining teams and singles based on results in the round robin.

9.0 TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE:

In the team competition, all ties split the points available (individual ties receive one-half point each, team pinfall ties receive one and one-half points each).

Should there be a tie for team positions after the round robin, the team with the best record against the opponent will receive the higher position. If still tied, the team with the highest pinfall against the opponent will receive the higher position.

Should there be a tie for individual positions after the round robin, the individuals will bowl a three frame roll off. (Frames 8, 9, and 10).

A match play format shall be used to determine the Champions in all team stepladder games. Each bowler who beats their opponent on the opposing team shall receive one (1) point. Four (4) points shall be awarded to the team that has a higher pinfall for the game, making a total of nine (9) points maximum for the game

10.0 SPORT PROTEST PROCEDURE:

All protests must be submitted in writing within 30 minutes of the completion of



the game under protest. In cases involving disputed pinfall (i.e. Slow falling pins) the decision of the Judge of Play is FINAL.

11.0 EQUIPMENT:

Personal balls may be used but are subject to random inspection. Personal balls must conform to standards:

WEIGHT – 3 lbs. 6 oz. to 3lbs. 10 oz. DIAMETER – 4 ¾ inches to 5 inches

16.0 DISTRICT TEAMS SELECTION CRITERIA

Generic:

Each District will hold a roll-off to select team members.

Special Olympics:

All teams must submit a complete team roster with the Provincial Office by December 15, 2013. Any team member listed on the final team roster must have participated in the District Qualifying Competition.

Teams must conform to standards set out in Sections 4.1, *Athlete Eligibility* and 4.4, *Team Definition and Alterations*.

The 2013 Bob Pedde Memorial Bowling Tournament has been sanctioned by Special Olympics Saskatchewan as the qualifier for the 2014 Saskatchewan Winter Games. Districts wishing to use an alternate tournament for district team selection must contact the Provincial Office prior to September 1, 2013.

Alternate SOS Provincially Sanctioned District Qualifiers must include **all** teams within that district with the intention of advancing to the 2014 Saskatchewan Winter Games, and results must be forwarded to the Provincial Office prior to December 15, 2013.
